

Lastly, a quick reflection on **FIG Working Week 2025** in Brisbane—fantastic sessions but website usability could improve. Next year: Cape Town!





This quarter, the team led by **Marisa Balas** and **Kate Fairlie** had a productive period, actively participating in key sessions at the Working Week and advancing collaborative projects. Highlights included the well-attended WLRs session with 50 participants and four papers presented, along with a summary review of **Publication 24**. The team also engaged in SDG Task Force sessions focused on **SDGs 1.4.2** and **5.a.1** and contributed to the **C8** session on **Gender** and Spatial Land Governance. Progress was made on Publication 24 with an agreed work schedule and author list, while new partnerships were formed with Commission 1 for **Publication 17 (Code of Conduct)**, and with **GLTN**, **UN-Habitat**, and the **National Surveyors Association of Kenya** for the Clinic Day Initiative. Discriminatory social norms confine women to care roles impact women's access to land and land tenure security.

Rural women in Colombia face barriers to access, control, and usufruct land. This reality is exacerbated by gender inequalities in care responsibilities that reinforce male predominance in inheritance and headship.

Using machine learning algorithms to predict the gender of interested parties in land transactions, Colombia is able to illustrate that women own less land in rural areas, participate less in the real estate market, and are disadvantaged in transactions such as purchases, inheritances, marital settlements, and land titles.

Attention to Social Institutions and Champions of Change

In Mongolia and Tanzania, the Women's Land Tenure Security (WOLTS) Project, focused on nurturing cohorts of **gender and land champions**, both women and men, which led to forming a critical mass for change, not only around local land governance, land management, and landscape development planning, but also in broader social norms.

A focus on gender rather than solely on women, and the practice of including men and fostering support from community leaders, has allowed attitudes about land rights and governance to evolve in an unthreatening way.

Reforms are very much needed to improve women's access to land.

Since 2015, Uruguay has defined policies to promote joint ownership of land for couples, including those in de facto unions. This was formalized in 2019, recognizing co-ownership when both partners are actively involved in farming activities. As a result, female ownership of family farms increased from 11% in 2014 to 34% in 2023.

Furthermore, women in Uruguay benefit from legal protections in housing-related judicial proceedings.

WG7.7 Land Administration Education

Led by **Assoc. Prof. Simon Hull** simon.hull@uct.ac.za, in Q2 this group:

Led by Royal Mabakeng and Simon Hull, the LA Ed Working Group is preparing an extended abstract for the Annual Meeting in Florianopolis in November. The paper is an exploration of various published guidelines for land administration (and related) curriculum development and implementation. The next phase, with anticipated presentation at the Congress in May 2026, will be a comparison of existing curricula against these guidelines.

In **June 2025, Commission 3 and 9** are joining the **UNECE** for a Housing and Land Management workshop. Grazyna Wiek-Roy will host a discussion around the various curriculum development guidelines, asking whether curriculum developers are being pointed in the same general direction. Her findings will be used to support the AM paper.

Through **NELGA** and with support from **GIZ**, a **TERLA MOOC** is under development and it is hoped it will be released in August/September of 2025. The Working Group has been providing comments and input into the MOOC's development.

Led by **Grazyna Wiek-Roy**, with support from **Uchendu Chigbu** and Simon Hull, the Working Group is looking at repeating the review of TERLA uptake done in 2021 (presented at the e-Working Week) with the aim to present the findings at the Congress in May 2026. By then, five years would have elapsed since the previous review. As always, the intention of the Working Group is to spread the word about the TERLA and support its further uptake.

Finally, on the somewhat frivolous side, the WG chair (Simon Hull) has been exploring what **ChatGPT** knows about him. During the conversation, he asked it to make a figurine / avatar of himself. The results have ranged from cute to scary to funny. Why? you ask. Partly curiosity, partly vanity, partly fun, but partly because these types of AI are here to stay and are getting better - as educators, we need to be familiarising ourselves with how to use them, because our students are almost definitely ahead of us!


