- Polytechnics In Ghana
- > Tertiary Institutions Specialised in Middle-Level Technical Education
- > Before 1993,the polytechnics were running second-cycle courses and the universities were running higher tertiary courses creating a gap in the country's manpower needs
- In 1993, the polytechnics were upgraded to tertiary institutions to train middle-level technical manpower

OBJECTIVES OF THE POLYTECHNICS

- Provide tertiary technical education in manufacturing, commerce, science, technology, applied social science and arts.
- Encourage study in technical subjects at tertiary level
- Provide opportunity for research and publication of research findings.

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT AND COLLABORATION

- The following institutions are responsible for quality assurance in polytechnic education
- Ministry of Education (MoE) has ministerial responsibility for all levels of education
- National Council for Tertiary Education (NCTE) advises the Ministry on matters relating to the development of tertitary education
- > National Accreditation Board (NAB) accredits programmes run in the polytechnics
- National Board for Professional and Technical Education (NABPTEX) formulates and administer schemes of examinations

ROLE OF THE POLYTECHNICS IN SURVEYING EDUCATION

- Surveying technicians are indispensable in the collection and analysis of field data required for decision making
- Technical education in Building Technology is run in all Polytechnics
- Technical Education in Estate Management is run at K' Polv
- Plans are underway for the introduction of HND in Land Surveying

THE ESTATE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME AT K' POLY

- The Need for Technical Education in Estate Management
- The efficiency of any organisation is linked to the physical environment within which it operates
- The need to manage land and buildings and to ensure maximun utility and functionality
- Commencement of Programme
- Programme commenced in 1995/96 Academic Year

THE PROGRAMME

- **Entry Requirements**
- Passes in English, Mathematics & Science Plus 3 Elective Passes including Geography and Economics with an aggregate not exceeding 24
- Five (5) G.C.E "O" Level Credits including English Language and Mathematics and 3 G.C.E "A" Level Passes including Geography and Economics plus General Paper

- Must be at least 30 years old
 Must have five (5) GCE "O" Level credits including English Language and
 Mathematics
- Must have relevant working experience (letter from employer is required)

REQUIREMENT FOR RETENTION

- Students are Expected to:
- ✓ take part in all coursework which includes class work (theory and practicals), seminars and assignments
- pass all subjects including those referred at the end of each academic year
- maintain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 1.50 throughout the duration of the programme

AWARD OF HND ESTATE MANAGEMENT

- At the end of the programme, successful students are awarded the Higher National Diploma by the Polytechnic in conjunction with the National Board for Professional and Technician Examinations (NABPTEX)
- For the award of the HND in Estate Management, a student must pass all subjects and completed one semester industrial attachment

The Industrial Attachment

- The department organises 6-months industrial attachment programme for its students to equip them with the skills needed for postqualification employment
- Through the attachment, the department maintains a strong relationship with industry and the Ghana Institution of Surveyors through the many firms who are involved in the training of our students
- Lecturers in the department embark on periodic follow-up visits to assess the performance of the students at the workplaces
- Students submit reports on the attachment for assessment and grading
- The students defend their reports in the presence of their peers and lecturers for further assessment
