

Target 1.4: “By 2030, ensure that all men and women...have equal rights to ...**ownership and control over land** and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources...”



Target 2.3: “By 2030, double the agricultural productivity and incomes of small-scale food producers...through **secure and equal access to land...**”





The target implicates the importance of reducing inequality regarding access to land and protection of tenure rights against discriminatory policies and practices.





In order to achieve the goal of combatting climate changes and the related impacts, land management planning and active use of geospatial data are key elements





Land professionals in common, and in particular, the Hydrographic Surveyor, has a key role in developing an understanding of our seas and oceans for the wider social benefits.




